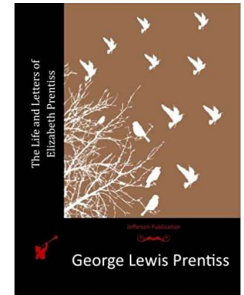
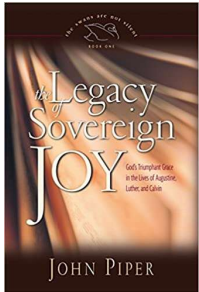

Elizabeth Prentiss (1818-1878) was the youngest daughter of one of the great revival preachers of the early 1800's, the Reverend Edward Payson, of Portland, Maine. The key note of her religious character is truck in her famous hymn – **More Love to Thee, O Christ**. She is best known in our day for her marvelous book Stepping Heavenward which has touched the heart strings of tens of thousands of women the world over. Her *Life & Letters* is reprinted with the prayerful hope that her character will induce women to immitate her faith in those dark days.



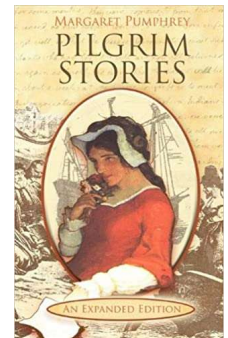

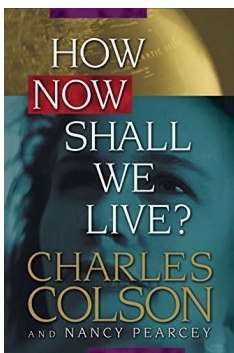
