





Writing to concerned women and church officers, Aimee Byrd pinpoints the problem, especially the commodification of womens ministry. She answers the hot-button issues – How can women grow in discernment? How should pastors preach to women? What are men’s and women’s roles within the church? – and points us in the direction of multifaceted solution. After all, cultivating resolved, competent women will equip them to fulfill their calling as Christ’s disciples and men’s essential allies. If we want to strengthen the church, we must strengthen the women in it!
